- Originally conceived in 2019–2020 by our Committee, previously named the Peer Services Community Committee
- Collecting content for digital preservation-related policies, procedures and workflows for COPPUL Peer Cohorts to use
- Organized using the three-legged stool model of digital preservation; stored on the Committee's Google Drive

File links for resources and examples in the folders according to the following table, based on the three-legged stool model from the DPM workshop.

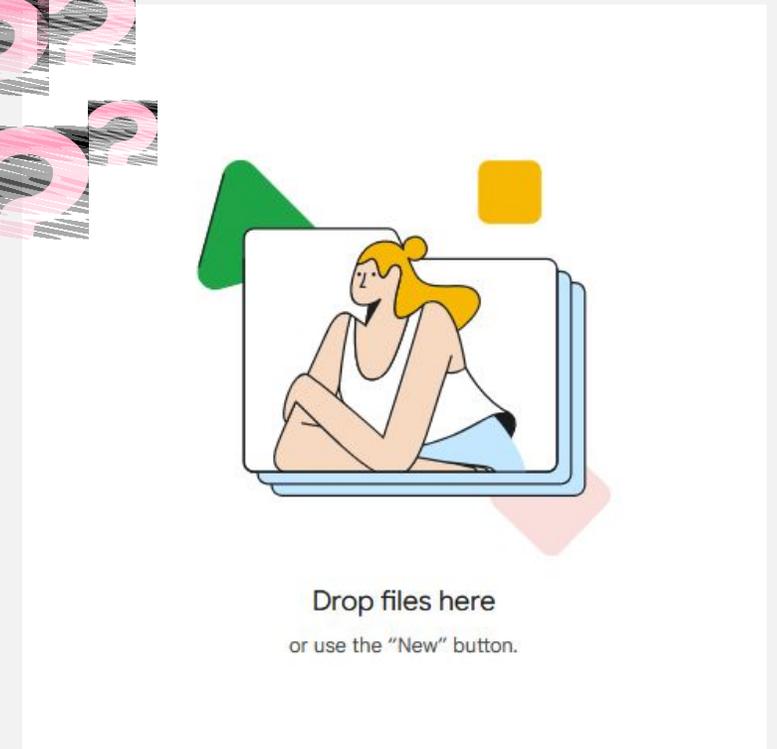
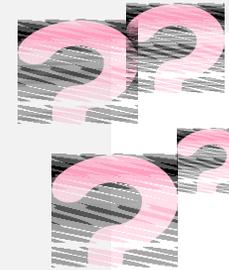
Use the general folder for broad community organizations and initiatives such as the Digital Preservation Coalition and the Digital Preservation Management Workshop.

ISSUES

- Materials became out of date quickly
- Focus on practical workflows made by members – no theory documents
- Documents could make sense in multiple "legs" at the same time
- Some folders had no content at all! :(

BLUE-SKYING

- In mid-2024, the CoP Planning Committee began blue-skying and imagining a resource that we actually wanted to use
- Broadened the scope from just digital preservation, to digital stewardship
 - "includ[ing] preservation within the contexts of digital archiving, digital curation, digital libraries, and other overlapping responsibilities relevant to participants working in different organizational contexts." (SAA Glossary)
- Not just workflows, but our favourites – greatest hits, widely available resources on all aspects of stewardship
- Began developing our Resource Primer (known affectionally by us as our "drafty draft worky work")

Purpose

The COPPUL Digital Stewardship Network (CDSN) Community of Practice (CoP) aims to build digital preservation capacity through peer collaboration and knowledge sharing. One way we hope to accomplish this is through the maintenance of a shared library of digital stewardship resources in Zotero.

The Resource Library is a living repository of best practices as well as a space where digital stewardship practitioners can share expertise and perspectives reflected through the documentation they create. Many CDSN CoP members have common interests but differ in context by size, type, mandate, regionality and communities served. Collecting all of these resources together can help break down institutional barriers and empower community members to carry out preservation activities with practical guidance and examples.

ZOTERO

- Tagging – solves the issue of multiple resources fitting multiple themes
- Not only the metadata record of a resource, but also has ability to add associated files as attachments
- Better access – Zotero is set to public, so anyone can access the Resource Library
